

Fondation Fyssen aims at “encouraging all forms of scientific inquiry into cognitive mechanisms, including thought and reasoning, which underlie animal and human behavior, their biological and cultural bases, as well as their phylogenetic and ontogenetic development”.

The 2023 Fyssen International Prize will be awarded for research in :

COGNITION AND RELIGION

Cognition plays an important role in theories of religion and religious practices can evidently influence cognitive processes – but how is the relation between the two best captured and is there one approach that can account for influences in both directions ?

The Prize will be awarded to an internationally recognized scholar who has significantly advanced our understanding of the relation between cognition and religion.

This Prize will be awarded to a scientist who has conducted distinguished research in the areas supported by the Foundation: **Ethology, Psychology, Neurobiology, Social Anthropology, Ethnology, Human Palaeontology and Archaeology.**

It is expected that the applicant would have influenced significantly cognitive sciences at the international level.

The award for the International Prize is **100 000 €**.

The application must be submitted by a recognized scientist and include:

- A recommendation letter,
- A curriculum vitae and a list of publications,
- A summary (four pages maximum) of the scientific achievements that justify the awarding of the Prize.
